Step2 下载并打印 Study Abroad Evaluation of Credit Form(<https://oia.osu.edu/pdf/eval1.pdf>)，在网上找到确认对应课程 department 的 transfer credit coordinator 的联系方式(http://registrar.osu.edu/Transfer_Credit/tcc_list.asp)。

Step3 带着 AUIA 课程大纲及 Study Abroad Evaluation of Credit Form 找自己的 transfer credit coordinator 评估可以上哪些课程，并签字确认。

Step4 把签好字的 Study Abroad Evaluation of Credit Form 保存好，电子版邮件发给 Tony Valle，邮箱地址：valle.5@osu.edu。或者纸质版复印件交到 100 Denney Hall, 164 W Seventeenth Avenue。

Step5 暑假去 AUIA 国际暑期学校上课，成绩达到 C 或者 C 以上。

Step6 课程结束后，成绩单会从 AUIA 举办暑期课程的大学直接寄送给负责学生暑假项目的 study abroad coordinator。

Why should I study abroad?

Whether you choose to study in Africa, Asia, Australia, the Middle East, North America or South America, you will benefit both personally and professionally from this life-changing experience.

You can earn academic credit, fulfilling requirements in your major, minor or elective coursework; experience hands-on learning and gain invaluable intellectual insight.

You'll develop global competencies: the ability to work effectively in international settings; an awareness of and adaptability to diverse cultures, perspectives and approaches; a familiarity with major currents of global change and the issues they raise; effective communication skills that can cross cultural and linguistic boundaries; and a comprehension of the international dimensions of your field of study.

You will be able to prepare for your future. Education abroad provides problem-solving skills, as well as a sense of direction and purpose for your future career. You'll learn how to work independently and as part of a team, all the while developing self reliance and an adventurous spirit.

Isn't education abroad expensive?

Education abroad is an investment in yourself and your future. The Office of International Affairs strives to develop programs that are as affordable as possible. All Ohio State students may apply for grants and scholarships, and can apply most of their financial aid to study abroad program costs as well.

Will I still be able to graduate on time if I study abroad?

Ohio State grants graded academic credit for study abroad programs, so you can continue to make regular academic progress. In fact, the majority of students who study abroad complete their coursework by their intended graduation date, and often you'll know how much credit you'll earn before you've even left for your study abroad program.

What subjects can I study abroad?

You don't need to be a foreign language or international studies major to study abroad; Ohio State students can study a wide variety of subjects in another country. You can take classes in your minor, satisfy GE requirements or try something new. Experiences and skills that you learn while abroad can apply to almost any field.

Don't I have to be an "A" student to study abroad?

No, but you do need to be academically ready to study in another country. Generally, a GPA of 2.5 or better is required.

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Can I still study abroad if I'm not taking a foreign language?

Despite what you might think, you don't need to speak a foreign language to study abroad. Our large variety of programs allows for many different education abroad experiences - many programs allow study in English, some require a foreign language background and some provide you with intensive foreign language study.

Isn't it going to be difficult?

Education abroad is challenging, but the Office of International Affairs will orient you before you departure, introduce you to Ohio State students who have studied abroad, provide information on getting a passport, talk to you about your health and safety abroad and more.

How long can I study abroad?

The Office of International Affairs has programs that last as little as one week and as long as one year - with everything in between!

When should I start planning to study abroad?

It's never too early to start planning; ideally, getting started one year in advance of your departure allows sufficient time for thorough planning and preparation.

When is the best time to study abroad?

Some programs require junior or senior standing, but most study abroad programs can be arranged anytime, beginning your freshman year.

What options are there for studying abroad on a semester calendar?

There are a number of options: autumn semester, lasting from late August through mid-December (includes winter break programs); spring semester, lasting from early January through late April (including spring break programs); and summer term, consisting of May and summer sessions.

Can you tell me more about studying abroad during May?

The Office of international Affairs offers quite a few study abroad programs during May, including Global May programs, which themselves provide an introduction to education abroad. One restriction to note is that students cannot graduate before studying abroad on a May program; graduation at the end of summer session will be possible in many cases.

May programs depart in the month of May and do not exceed four weeks. Credit hours earned in May will be added to credit hours earned in summer session to determine the amount of your federal financial aid. Payment due dates for May study abroad programs will follow the university's summer term due dates.

On-campus housing will be available during May for students who plan to participate in study abroad programs that require students to take an on-campus component before departing for the component abroad.

How can I choose the best program for me?

There are a variety of program types that give you the option of choosing when, where and how long you study abroad. You can study abroad with students from Ohio State, or you can choose a program that will include students from other universities. You can also study abroad through an exchange program, which would allow you to travel independently.

Some study abroad program classes are completed on campus before departing overseas. Other programs

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immerse the students in a classroom setting in another country for a semester or more. Our Choosing the Right Program and Ways to Study Abroad pages should help you decide what option is right for you.

Where can I learn more about education abroad?

You can search available programs online anytime, but to learn the basics about education abroad, you should first attend a Getting Started session. If you have specific questions about a program, schedule an appointment with the appropriate education abroad coordinator during their office hours.

CREDIT EVALUATION

For most programs, it is best to obtain pre-approval for the courses you will be taking while studying abroad. Each academic department at Ohio State has a transfer credit coordinator with whom you will need to work to obtain this pre-approval. Depending on your course selections, you may need to meet with coordinators from several different departments.

To ensure that the appropriate transfer credit coordinators complete the Study Abroad Evaluation of Credit Form correctly and within an appropriate timeframe:

- Review the course descriptions on your third party, direct enroll or exchange program website and determine what courses you intend to take while abroad. It is a good idea to have several “back-up” courses approved, in case the courses you intend to take are not offered or are full.
- Identify the transfer credit coordinator for the department in which you wish to receive credit. View the transfer credit coordinator list to find the appropriate contact.
- If you wish to receive credit from different departments, you must meet with the transfer credit coordinator in each department.
- For each transfer credit coordinator with whom you meet, you will need to have a copy of the Study Abroad Evaluation of Credit Form. You will also need to have a copy of the syllabus or course description for each class you plan to take during the study abroad program.
- At the meeting, you need to bring copies of all appropriate documentation with you. You may need to leave the Evaluation of Credit form with the transfer credit coordinator and pick it up at a later date. In most cases, the coordinator will be able to pre-approve your proposed education abroad courses for equivalent Ohio State credit. However, in some instances, the coordinator may need additional information and will not be able to evaluate a course prior to your departure. If this occurs, please encourage the coordinator to contact your program's education abroad coordinator with any questions.
- Return the completed Evaluation of Credit Form electronically to Tony Valle, education abroad liaison for the College of Arts and Sciences. If the form is sent electronically, it must come from the Ohio State email address of the transfer credit coordinator. Alternatively, the student may submit a signed hard copy to 135 Denney Hall, 164 W Seventeenth Avenue.

- All courses that you complete abroad must be evaluated for graded Ohio State University credit.
- Some transfer credit coordinator may not sign off on a course until you have returned from your education abroad experience. If you meet with the coordinator upon return, you may be required to show a syllabi, transcript and completed coursework. Please be sure to bring course materials home with you.
- A transfer credit coordinator cannot sign off on a course that is not within his or her department. For example, someone in the History department cannot sign off on International Studies credit.
- You must have all courses signed off before any of the credit that you obtained abroad can be posted to your record.
- You will have two semesters from the time that we receive your overseas transcript to complete this process. If you do not complete the process in the allowed time, a hold will be placed on your account.
- Once your credit evaluations and transcript are submitted to the sponsoring college's education abroad liaison, it may take up to a week for the credit to appear on your record. When the graded credit is posted, it will appear under the Transfer Credit tab of the Study Information System.
- You are responsible for making sure that a transcript is sent to our office. Many times this is done automatically, however, in some instances you may need to request one to be sent or it may be sent directly to you.
- If you had all courses that you took abroad pre-approved, the sponsoring college's education abroad liaison will notify the Registrar of the final results.
- If you took courses abroad that were not pre-approved, or you need to obtain final approval, you will need to visit with the appropriate transfer credit coordinator before any of the coursework you did abroad can be posted.
